

The Overdose Rescue Kit Program is designed to educate and train people without a medical background (a lay responder) to administer narcan/ naloxone to someone experiencing an opioid overdose. The kits contain information on treatment resources, harm reduction, and a single dose of nasal spray narcan/ naloxone. The kits are free of charge for family and friends of people at high risk of opioid overdose.

The Overdose Rescue Kit Program runs every Tuesday, except holidays, from 1-2pm on the second (2nd) floor of the Howard County Government Center, 120 E. Mulberry Street, Room 209. For other availability, appointments can be made by calling (765)456-2402 option 7.

The Howard County Government Center is the limestone building located at the Northwest corner of the intersection of Mulberry Street and Union Street; or directly West of the Kokomo Tribune building, and Northwest of the Kokomo Howard County Public Library.
